Children with or without special needs can demonstrate challenging behaviors that are often difficult for parents and school staff to understand or change. Upon completing her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology, she trained in Behavioral Psychology at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine and Kennedy Krieger. She was one of the founding directors of the Ivymount School Autism Program and has practiced for over 20 years.
